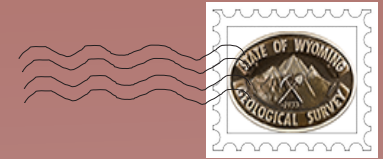


Next stop on the ABCs tour of Wyoming's geologic wonders ...

Aspen Mountain

- *12 miles southeast of Rock Springs*
- *Site of unusual rocks, including alunite, travertine, free sulfur, silicified breccia, kaolinite & jasperoid*
- *Mountain is capped by sandstone & quartzite of the Rock Springs Formation*
- *Provides a sweeping view to the north across the Rock Springs uplift, a prominent Laramide structure cut by U.S. Interstate 80 in southwestern Wyoming*
