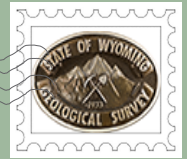


Next stop on the ABCs tour of Wyoming's geologic wonders ...



Quaternary deposits

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- *Taken on west side of the Upper Green River, about 30 miles north-northeast of Pinedale*
- *Quaternary deposits are modern to recent (geologically, <2.58 million years old) sedimentary deposits*
- *Rolling hills in the foreground are glacial deposits*
- *Flat ground in the middle of the valley is alluvium, which is the most common quaternary deposit*
